The Stigma of Mental Illness

Mental illnesses are physical brain disorders that profoundly disrupt a person's ability to think, feel, and relate to others and their environment. According to National Alliance for the Mentally Ill (NAMI), such severe disorders are more common than cancer, diabetes or heart disease. One in every five families is affected at some time in their lifetime by a severe mental illness such as bipolar disorder, schizophrenia and major depression. One in 10 children and adolescents have mental illnesses severe enough to cause some level of impairment.

Mental illness has traditionally been surrounded by community misunderstanding and even fear. Stigma emerges when people feel uneasy or embarrassed to talk about behavior they perceive as different. The stigma surrounding mental illness is often so strong that it places a wall of silence around this issue, and results in a significant barrier to people asking for and getting the help they need. This

misunderstanding and rejection of people with mental illness even spills over to the caregiver, family members, and community.

The first week in October is Mental Illness Awareness Week and reminds us that great strides have been made in recent years in the fight against mental illness. A wide array of effective new medications for severe mental illness have been developed. Genetic discoveries and progressive brain research continues to move closer to medical answers for living with and, perhaps even some day, preventing or curing severe mental illnesses. With proper treatment most people with a mental illness recover quickly, and can continue to live within their own family and be a productive member of their community.

Resolution published to levy tax for capitol outlay fund

Published in The Saint Francis Herald, St. Francis, Kansas, Thursdays, November 17 and November 24, 2005. (46-47)

Resolution to Levy Tax for Capital Outlay Fund

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of Unified School District No. 297, Cheyenne County, State of Kansas, is authorized by K.S.A. 72-8801, to make an annual tax levy at a mill rate not exceeding the statutorily-prescribed mill rate for a period of time not exceeding five years upon the taxable tangible property in the district for the purpose specified in said law; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has determined to exercise the authority vested in it by said law;

NOW, THEREFORE,

RESOLUTION

Be It Resolved that: The above-named school board shall be authorized to make an annual tax levy for a period not to exceed 5 years in an amount not to exceed 4 mills upon the taxable tangible property in the school district for the purpose of acquisition, construction, reconstruction, repair, remodeling, additions to, furnishing and equipping of buildings necessary for school district purposes, including housing and boarding pupils enrolled in an area vocational school operated under the board, architectural expenses incidental thereto, the acquisition of building

sites, the undertaking and maintenance of asbestos control projects, the acquisition of school buses and the acquisition of other equipment and for the purpose of paying a portion of the principal and interest on bonds issued by cities under the authority of K.S.A. 12-1774, and amendments thereto, for the financing of redevelopment projects upon property located within the school district. The tax levy authorized by this Resolution may be made, unless a petition in opposition to the same, signed by not less than 10% of the qualified electors of the school district, is filed with the county election officer of the home county of the school district within 40 days after the last publication of this Resolution. In the event a petition is filed, the county election officer shall submit the question of whether the tax levy shall be authorized to the electors in the school district at an election called for the purpose or at the next general election, as is specified by the Board of Education of the above school district.
