First new bench is completed

For several months, the St. Francis Area Chamber of Commerce has been discussing the replacement of the old wooden benches used at different events. Gordon Ross, Ross Manufacturing, was contacted and he agreed to build them but, they wouldn't be wood.

"It is time to retire the old wooden benches," said Robert Grace, one of the members of the Bench Committee, adding that the benches had served the community well for many years.

The first new bench has been completed and there are still 29 to be built. Some of the benches have already been donated by businesses, individuals and/or families.

There are five major events each year in St. Francis which require benches to accommodate the crowds. These events include the Car Show, the Stearman Fly-In, the Alumni Reunion, the county fair and the Relay For Life. Throughout the year, there are other times when

the benches are brought out of storage.

Mr. Grace said the new benches will be long-lasting, elegant, and best of all, they are 20 percent lighter than the old wooden benches. Those volunteers who have helped load and unload them through the years can appreciate that.

The cost of a bench is \$300 and includes the engraving of the business or family name in the center backrest slat. The advertising is limited to around 30 letters.

"We think that you should donate a bench because you want to support St. Francis' community events, but over the years, thousands of people will see the engraved logos, so there is some very real advertising value, too," Mr. Grace said.
