

Indians lose to Wildcats

After losing to Wallace County 67-54 on Tuesday night, Feb. 6, the Indians moved into the final two weeks of the regular season with a 12-4 record.

"Wallace County is another top ranked team," said Coach Ward

Mac Frewen and Ted Crabtree led the scoring against the Wallace County Wildcats with 17 and 11 points respectively.

The Indians were 34.6 percent from the field and 60.9 percent from the free-throw line. Two Indians were 100 percent from the threepoint shot area with M. Frewen being 2-of-2 and Adam Peter 1-of-1.

Having the best percentage from the two-point area was Frewen with 75 percent. Everyone else was below 50 percent. At the line Peter was 100 percent with 2-of-2 and Frewen was next with 5-of-6 for 83.3 per-
