U.S. 36 towns have winners

When it comes to the state high school wrestling champions, no one needs to look further than U.S. 36, which runs east to west across the northern tier of counties.

Schools along the road produced 31 wrestlers with at least a sixthplace finish out of the 70 possible places, 44 percent of the winning places at the Class 3-2-1A state tournament at Hays on Saturday. Among them were Oberlin's Jon Richards, second at 140 pounds, and Terry Urban, third at 171.

From St. Francis in the west as far east as Sabetha, just a few miles north of 36 on U.S. 75, the "Route of the Windmills" has developed into a vein of wrestling tradition.

That's 324 miles out of the 391 from the Colorado state line to Missouri, just 83 percent of the road, producing all those state champion high school wrestlers, said Fred Holthaus at the Kansas Department of Transportation.

The 2006 champions came from St. Francis, Atwood, Oberlin, Norton, Phillipsburg, Smith Center, Belleville and Sabetha.

U.S. 36, part of the original Pony Express route from St. Joseph, Mo., to Sacramento, Calif., is still producing the gritty, stubborn, nevergive-up men that forged these communities years ago.

"The Northwest Kansas League and the Mid-Continent league produce many fine wrestlers," said Adam Kadavy, KFNF radio playby-play announcer at the state tournament.
