As a little girl, Opal was raised on a farm south of Franklin. Her early elementary school years were spent attending one-room country schools. As a child of age 10, she moved with her parents, brothers and sisters to Haigler, Neb. It was in January, 1930, when her family loaded their belongings on a freight car and headed west to live in the Haigler community. Opal lived, worked and contributed to the Haigler community for the rest of her life, 76 years.

With a pioneer spirit and determination instilled in her by her parents, she experienced and survived the depression years of the 1930s, the flood of 1935, the blizzard of 1949, and the tornado of 1954.

Opal graduated from Haigler High School in 1937. Having learned the value of an education, she worked her way through two years of teacher training at Chadron State Teachers' College. As a young teacher, she taught in oneroom country schools at Sanborn, Districts 42 and 75, in Nebraska Schools, and East 10 and West 10 in Kansas schools. She also did substitute teaching for many years in the Haigler Public Schools, as well as serving on Parent Teacher Association committees and the Haigler School Board. 
