• Have you written down the answers to these questions to help inform your doctor about your health the next time you visit?

These are often good question to ask ourselves before visiting the doctor or pharmacist. Another way people can help take care of themselves is to have affordable "Prescription Drug Plans."

The Medicare Prescription Drug Plan can be a complicated issue. It is helpful to start asking yourself some important questions.

• Does the plan cover all of my medications?

• Is the plan accepted at my pharmacy?
