## Girls suffer losses

## Former resident's golf team takes state

Mike O'Leary, former St. Francis resident, now a golf coach for the Rockhurst Hawks, was featured in *The Kansas City Star* on May 16 and 17 when the team's combined score on May 16 was a 19-over-par 587 — the best Missouri state had seen since records were first kept in the 1930s. The next day, Rockhurst moved in for the win and took the Class 4 state title for the second year in a row.  
 In the Star article written by J. Brady McCollough, Coach O'Leary shares his thoughts and what he was going to tell his team after dominating the first round.  
 "I've never had a lead this big

at state in 27 years of coaching," he said.  
 It was O'Leary's job to say the right thing to make sure the Hawks didn't lose their grip on a second straight state title.  
 His first option was to give them all big hugs and tell them how great they were. However, he passed on that.  
 His second option was to remind the Hawks of last year. They played poorly on the first day and were in third place, nine shots back. Rockhurst flipped on the switch the second day and won the state title. Reverse psychology says if the Hawks aren't careful, the same thing could happen to them this year.

Or, if Coach O'Leary really wanted to challenge this group, he could tell them to go for the record. The best two-round total in state history is 21 over par.  
 "We really came together as a team," Jason Schulte, team member, said.  
 Schulte, John Kimminau and Tyler Bernard, Rockhurst's top three golfers didn't accomplish their individual goals, but despite their individual disappointments, the Hawks, as a team, were good enough to put the finishing touches on the best two-day performance in state history.  
 Rockhurst won by 14 strokes. The closest competitor, Park-

way South, had 601.  
 The Hawks' accomplishment would have been enough for most schools, but Rockhurst golfers don't play any other sports and commit themselves to golf year-round.  
 "I was going for the individual championship," Schulte said, "but for the team to win here is incredible. It's definitely a little sweeter being a senior this year."  
 The other two team members were Mike McGee and Andrew Campbell.  
 Coach O'Leary is the son of Arrilla Zimelman, St. Francis.
