Memorial service scheduled June 18

A memorial service for Dr. Lucille Stephenson will be held at 2 p.m. on Sunday, June 18, at the First Christian Church in St. Francis. Rev. John Bartlett will officiate the service.

Dr. Lucille, as she was fondly called, graduated from the University of Kansas in Lawrence with her medical degree in 1932. She practiced medicine in Denver, Kansas City, Mo., Leavenworth, Topeka, North Manchester, Ind., and Columbia, Mo., before coming to St. Francis in 1944. Through the years, she was committed to the county as a

physician and as a resident. She was interested in preserving the history of the county and helped establish the Cheyenne County Historical Society as well as being instrumental in having the museum, located in St. Francis, erected.

Born in 1906 at Phillipsburg, she lived a full life as a doctor, wife and mother. She was able to live at home until her later years when sickness and disabilities of old age caught up with her. She died on Dec. 19, 2005, in the Good Samaritan Village.

Candidate to run for board of education

A candidate for the State Board of Education will be in Cheyenne County to talk to residents about issues in education.



Cauble

Republican Sally Cauble, Liberal, will be in St. Francis from 5 to 7 p.m. on June 15 at the senior center at 322 W. Washington.

The Kansas Alliance for Education has endorsed both Ms. Cauble and Tim Cruse, Garden City, in the upcoming election for the 5th District State Board of Education. This district covers 44 counties in western Kansas, all within Senate Districts 37, 38, 39 and 40.

Ms. Cauble will run against the incumbent Connie Morris, St. Francis, in the August primary. Mr. Cruse has filed as a Democrat and will run against the primary winner in the November general election.

Don Hineman, Dighton rancher and chair of the Alliance, said all three candidates were mailed questionnaires, responses were received from them and they were invited to interview with the Alliance.

"Sally Cauble and Tim Cruse accepted our offer," he said. "Both candidates are quite capable and would represent the taxpayers of the 5th District well."

"These highly qualified individuals would help steer the State Board of Education toward providing the best possible education for the children of Kansas and away from the radical agenda recently pursued by the current six-member majority.

"We believe that when voters look at the answers to these questions and at the record of the current board member, they will decide that it is time for a change," said Terry Woodbury, Alliance member from Leoti.

The Alliance was formed last October for the expressed purpose of promoting education of candidates to the Kansas State Board of Education who support quality education for all Kansas children.

"We plan to inform voters in the 5th District on the issues and on the best state board candidates to represent their interests and the interests of their children."
