### Ordinance amending court cost for the city

Published in The Saint Francis Herald, St. Francis, Kansas, Thursday, August 17, 2006. (33)

**ORDINANCE NUMBER 536 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 9-111 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS, AND ESTABLISHING MUNICIPAL COURT COSTS FOR THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS THAT, Section 9-111 of the 2003 Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas, shall be amended to read as follows:

9-111 COURT COSTS. When a person pleads guilty, is found guilty or pleads no contest, there shall be

assessed court costs in the amount of \$65.00. Additionally, when applicable, the following shall apply.

(a) Witness fees and mileage as set forth in K.S.A. 12-4411.

(b) Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) additional fee for installment payments of fines and court costs.

This Section 9-111, as amended, shall be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper, **Saint Francis Herald**.
