The Community Development Block Grant funds can be used for a variety of things, including construction, livestock, working capitol, etc. The loan is generally about 3 percent below prime and can be set up so the first 18 months are interest only.

The dairy expects to create 19 new jobs. The funds will be used to purchase equipment, cattle and for working capital.

### Farmers may apply for emergency loan

#### "Farmers in Sherman, Cheyenne Eckhardt said. and Wallace counties, who suffered crop or livestock losses due to natural disasters may apply for Farm Service Agency emergency loans," Farm Service Agency Farm Loan Manager Patricia Eckhardt, said recently.

Counties also became eligible under existing legislation which provides that farmers in counties bordering on those which have been designated for disaster assistance, may also qualify for such assistance. Applications for assistance will be accepted by Farm Service Agency. Please contact the office for specific information and application deadlines.

"Loans covering physical and/ or production losses may be made at a 3.75 percent interest rate, and are scheduled for repayment as rapidly as feasible, consistent with the applicant's reasonable ability to pay," Ms. Eckhardt said.

Farm Service Agency loans covering physical losses may be used to replace installations, equipment, livestock, or buildings (including homes), lost through this disaster. Farm Service Agency loans covering production losses may be used to buy feed, seed, fertilizer, livestock, or to make payments on real estate and chattel debts. "Funds can also be used for other essential operating and living expenses," Ms.
