### Haigler memories

Wilma (DeGarmo) Ferguson, who grew up in Haigler, shares this response to Don Harford's "Haigler in the 1920s." Her observations of Haigler business district reflect changes that have taken place a generation later, about the late 1930s and 1940s. She writes about her memories, the first of three parts:

"I have enjoyed reading about Haigler in the by-gone days. I have a few things I would like to add. Don brought back some memories of places that I had forgotten...like Joe Warner and the coal sheds. The way I remember, starting at the north end of Main Street at the Equity - I only remember hearing about the Creamery. It later became part of the Locker Plant, I think. Then there was the Drug Store, the

Ventis Millinery (vaguely remember), then a pool hall, later it was a bowling alley, creamery run by Douglas's. It seems like there was a shoe repair shop later, then a home. Next was Andres barber shop, then the bank (now Post Office), Premer Hardware which later was O'Brien's, Bryan, then Earl Trembly. Then Armstrong's Grocery and Dry Goods, later being Ed McKinney's and later Ed Odenbach's creamery,

Post Office. In the back of it Mr. Larnard had an office, later Ruth Andres had a furniture store and it seems like a flower shop was there for a while. West of there was the Cozy Inn (later McKay's built a car dealership north of there). Across the highway north was Garnet Hoover's garage and filling station (later becoming Hugh McKay's and his son Wally joined him.)
