Two accidents happen within minutes

Two separate accidents occurred Friday afternoon, both around 1:20. The site of the first accident was at the intersection of Roads R and 13, northwest of St. Francis. The second accident happened after the firemen were called to assist in working the accident and the fire chief hit a vehicle on the way to the fire station.

Darrel Zweygardt, 52, St. Francis, was delivering mail going

west on Road R. Merlyn Sherlock, 72, St. Francis, was traveling north on Road 13 when he failed to yield the right of way and hit the side of the Zweygardt vehicle.

Zweygardt, who was driving a 1990 Buick, ended up in the ditch. The 1994 Jeep which Sherlock was driving, landed on its side in the ditch. Neither men were wearing seat belts.

Both men were taken to the Cheyenne County Hospital by

ambulance and later, Sherlock was flown by medical plane to Swedish Medical Center in Englewood. He is reported to have broken bones in the face, neck and leg and is still hospitalized. Zweygardt was released from the hospital with multiple bruises and a cut on the head.

Fire chief George Harper, St. Francis, was riding his 2000 Honda motorcycle on College Street on his way to the firehouse. He attempted

to pass Roger Neitzel, driving a 1995 Chevy pickup, and, as he passed, he said he realized that Neitzel was turning. He struck the left front of the pickup and was thrown off the motorcycle.

He was taken to the hospital and later transported to a hospital in Greeley, Colo., with broken bones in the leg and a crushed knee cap. He underwent surgery and is expected to be back in St. Francis within the week.
