# Resident recalls years growing up

Eva Ann Murray is the September Good Samaritan Village resident of the month.  
Mrs. Murray was born on the Big Timber north of Bird City on Feb. 6, 1909. Her parents, George and Mary Pyle, had nine children and all were raised on the Big Timber.  
As she was growing up, Mrs. Murray milked cows, helped with the gardening and gathered the cattle. In fact, some of her fond childhood memories include milking the cows outside and riding horses to school.  
She attended Baker School near her home, and she remembers Stella Pettit as one of her favorite teacher. Her mother died when Mrs. Murray was fairly young and she

went to work outside the home.  
On March 15, 1930, Eva Ann married John Murray in St. Francis. She said Roy Connett told John to come to his place one night, they met and went on a date. Through their married life, Mrs. Murray was a housewife and the couple lived south of Bird City on the Murray farm.  
They had two daughters, Hollis in 1932, and Elaine in 1935. Today, they have three grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.  
Mrs. Murray liked to quilt, embroidery, crochet and working in her garden. She became a resident of the Good Samaritan Village on Dec. 12, 2005.
