Part three of three. Next (after Odenbach's creamery, south to north) was the Haigler Newspaper which was a weekly. The editor of the Stratton News Paper came to Haigler and published the paper for awhile. When I was in my early high school years I worked there and helped fold papers. I think Mildred Woods and her husband were the last editors. Next was the Lumber Shed, the Doctor's Office - later Cooley's Liquor, then a dwelling. Stan Webster now lives there.

Across the street was the elevator, railroad tracks, the Depot. I had forgotten the water tank but remember it now. I remember the Sale Pavilion and going to a Christmas program, the really bright lights and a little girl having a bright red dress. The pump house for the town water was next in line going north.

Back to the block East of Main Street to the North was W.F. Wood's Buildings. I didn't remember what all was there but I remember the folks talking about it. Later it was Stasser's Garage and Car

Dealership. On the next corner on the north side of the Highway 34 was a filling station. They later put a Cafe in the east end of it. On east at the old junction of Highways 34 and 27, on the north was a garage run by Ed Pierson, later Ward Wonder had it. Later on the South side of 34 Junction of 27 was a Motel Volland Schmutte had for a few years.

The Saturday night activity I remember well. I was one of the girls that went down one side of the street and up the other. There would be groups sometimes. Mom would stand or sit in the stores and visit. It was a Big Deal!
