box.," Sheriff Gardner said. The new addressing scheme will allow emergency responders to pinpoint exactly where they need to respond. By simply knowing

cated on, what the cross roads are on what side of the road the residence is located, and how far the residence is located from the nearst cross road.
The new addressing scheme is required in order to facilitate the grant process for obtaining state/ federal funding for Enhanced 911 .
