# Indians begin District play

The first six football games of the season, all against Northwest Kansas League teams, are history. The Indians ended this portion of the schedule with a 5-1 record. This includes as 49-13 win over the Quinter Bulldogs on Friday

District games begin this Friday when St. Francis travels to Syracuse for the first of three games which will decide which squads will represent District 14 in post-season

The other two teams in District 14, Wichita County/Leoti and Rawlins County/Atwood, will also meet Friday. Each team will play every other team in the District. The final two meetings will take place on Friday, Oct. 20, and Thursday, Oct. 26. The two teams with the best District record will qualify for postseason play.

Each team in the state begins District play with a 0-0 record.

"We are going to work really hard to win the District," Coach Tim Lambert said.

"We feel pretty good about the season so far. We just keep working to get better.'

On Friday night in Quinter, the Indians scored in each of the four quarters with the starters, who were playing strong, being supplemented by younger players as the game progressed. This has been a pattern in the majority of the games this year.

"It is good to give the younger players some varsity experience,"

Coach Lambert said. Jordan Gienger took the ball in for the first score from 1-yard out with David Guthmiller adding two points for an 8-0 advantage. Before the end of the quarter, Guthmiller broke away from the 15-yard line for the second touchdown to give the Indians a 14-0 lead after one.

As had happened in the Hoxie game, St. Francis used the pass to add an offensive option. Quarterback Ted Crabtree hit AJ McAtee on a 21-yard touchdown play, moving the Indians advantage to 26-0. A Gienger after-touchdown kick added an additional point.

One more score was recorded before halftime. This took place when J. McAtee went into the end zone from within the 5-yard line. A kick by Gienger was successful. The Indians were up by 34 points at halftime.

"We played pretty well against Quinter," Coach Lambert said. 'The kids did some good things."

The Bulldogs opened the scoring in the third quarter but Sainty answered them with a 69-yard touchdown play by J. McAtee. A Gienger rushing attempt added two points and Sainty was ahead 42-6.

Trent Raile, Trent Kinen and Jesse Pacheco had been used on offense at times during the evening and the final touchdown of the Indians' night was scored on a 6-yard run by Raile. Gienger had a success-
