## Grocery store gives money

Last week, St. Francis Super's manager Bob Weatherly, handed three groups checks totaling \$2,250.  
The grocery store has continued to award money to organizations collecting \$150,000 in store receipts. In return, the organization receives a check for \$1,000.  
Those getting \$1,000 checks on Friday were the St. Francis Senior Center and Peace Lutheran Church Women group.  
On Oct. 7, St. Francis Super's had sponsored a rib eye steak sandwich lunch. Proceeds came to \$250 and

it was donated to the St. Francis Community High School drama department.  
This is the second \$1,000 check the senior center has received, the last one being about a year ago. Art Krueger, Ken Quigley and ErvaGene DeAragon were there to accept the check.  
The senior center has many places where the money could go including paying the monthly bills but, it was the consensus of the group that it would be put toward new wiring in the center.  
Lea Keller, one of those accepting the check for Peace Lutheran

Church, said that the money will be put in the budget for mission work and maybe improving the home church property.  
David Morrow, drama teacher, was thrilled with the \$250.  
"That Bob (Weatherly) is a 'stand-up' guy," Mr. Morrow said.  
The tentative plans are to use the \$250 for students to attend a musical or dinner theater in Denver.
