Lexi, had a part in the church service at Salem Lutheran Church. She did a great job with her lines. It doesn't matter if you are not a

Lutheran, if you enjoy history and old churches, a visit to Salem is worth the trip. It is located in the country on Road 9, about eight miles northwest of St. Francis.

The church was built in 1901 by German Lutherans who had immigrated to the high plains of Kansas. While sitting in the pews and listening to the wind whip outside, it takes little imagination to join those who built the beautiful church.

But my special moment came when most of the lights were turned off on Christmas Eve and the only light was from the candles we held. The congregation sang "Silent Night, Holy Night." It sounded nice, as it always had to me before, then a handful of singers performed the final stanza in German!

The original carol is called "Stille Nacht, Heilige Nacht." It was written by an assistant pastor, Fr. Joseph Mohr, and introduced on Christmas Eve. 1818, in the village church of Oberndorf, Austria. Mohr's friend, a musician and school teacher, Franz Gruber, arranged the music.

At a Midnight Mass at the St. Nicholas Church, some 180 years ago, Fr. Mohr played a guitar and the choir sang in German.

Somehow, in that old country church on that blessed night, all was calm and all was bright. Or, should I say, "Alles schlaft; einsam wacht."

Surviving family includes his wife, Viola Peck, Goodland; two sons, Doug Peck and his wife, Cheryl, Goodland; Kenneth Peck Jr. and his wife, Patty, Winter Springs, Fla.; two daughters, Barbara Van Allen and her husband, Robert, Wheeler; Rebecca Baney and her husband, Rick, Des Moines, Iowa; eight grandchildren; and 11 greatgrandchildren.
