Stuffed Ham And Swiss Potatoes

4 large baking potatoes 1 cup diced ham 1 cup shredded Swiss cheese 1/2 cup thinly sliced green onions

1/2 cup sour cream 1/4 teaspoon black pepper

Pierce potatoes with a fork. Arrange in a circle on paper towels in microwave oven. Microwave on high for 6 minutes; turn potatoes over and microwave for 6 more minutes or until done. Let stand five minutes. Preheat broiler. Cut each potato in half length-wise; scoop out pulp into mixing bowl. Set shells aside. Combine potato pulp, ham, 1/2 of the cheese, 1/2 of the onions, sour cream and pepper. Spoon the potato mixture into shells. Combine remaining cheese and onions and sprinkle over potato halves. Place on baking sheet and broil four minutes or until golden. Makes




