

Top each with cheese, bacon and remaining biscuit half Makes 8 sandwiches.

Theologians' decision complicates lives

Colby Free Press A group of great theologians from all over the known world gathered in Nicaea in A.D. 325. Nicaea is now located in what we know as Turkey. These theologians probably never realized how they were complicating the lives of the generations to come.

What they accomplished was establishing a formula for arriving at the annual date for Easter. Making it certain that the holiday would fall on a different Sunday each year.

Easter, it was decreed, would be ob-

which is March 20. The confusion has no longer make their pilgrimages by continued through more than 17 centuries. This year Easter will be observed on April 15.

What the theologians did in A.D. 325 was not for theological purposes, but for practical considerations. At that time, many Christian pilgrims going to Jerusalem for the Easter festival, traveled in groups down the eastern side of the Mediterranean Sea. They were constantly harassed by robbers, especially at night.

The council thought these Christians served on the first Sunday after the first would be safer if they had the full moon

full moon, after the vernal equinox, to light their pathway. Today, travelers the light of the moon, but the ancient formula still stands. Therefore, Easter Sunday can fall anywhere within a 35day period from March 22 to April 25.

> Will it ever be changed? Many religious officials do not want to tamper with a decision made by the Council of Nicaea, the first general church council. That gathering in A.D. 325, lives in tradition as the most important council in the history of the church. This is when the Nicene Creed was formulated, along with the ancient formula for Easter Sunday.
