## Trojans take two

The Colby Community College swept Cloud County at Trojan Field in Colby on Saturday, winning 8-4 and 1-0. Trojan pitchers didn't give up a single earned run on the day.

Freshman right-hander Chris Johnson (2-7) pitched a complete game. He struck out four and walked three, scattering five hits.

Justin Lane had three hits and Justin Miller, Brady Nighswonger and Josh Prickett had two hits.

Lane, Miller and Nighswonger each hit doubles and Nighswonger and Prickett had three RBIs apiece.

Game two found the Trojans in a familiar spot, an extra-inning game, but this time they found a way to win. Sophomore second baseman Brady Nighswonger hit a one out double in the bottom of the tenth.

Freshman shortstop Josh Prickett

followed with a single and then stole second base.

Freshman Scott Kadatz came up and scorched a game winning single.

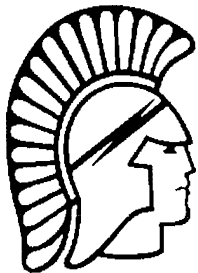
Defensively, Prickett had nine assists, including a backhand stab while moving to his right in the eighth.

Nighswonger started a double play with a backhanded flip in the third inning.

Seth Vontz pitched six innings of scoreless ball, but didn't get the win. James Allen recorded four strikeouts in four innings for his fifth win. Vontz and Allen combined for 10 innings with no walks.

Mike Kowalski, Nighswonger and Josh Prickett each had two hits, including a double for Kowalski.

The Trojans are off until the Region VI Sub-Regional Tournament in Hutchinson, May 11-13.



## Track team takes fourth in Garden City meet

GARDEN CITY — Colby High School's track teams took fourth at Garden City on Tuesday, behind Liberal, Garden City and Great Bend.

The girls had 62 points, behind number three Garden City's 93. Great Bend had 97 and Liberal had 212.

Ivy Ramsey was first in the 1600 at 5:40.47 and second in the 800 at 3:32.85.

The 4x100 girls relay team, Jess Stephenson, Brianna Swafford, Breann Hart and Jessie Brenn ran a

second-place 52.10.

Brenn also ran the 100 hurdles in 16.56 for second.

The 4x400 team, Ramsey, Hart, Summar Stephens and Brenn ran a 4:17.06 for second.

Swafford was fourth in the 100 at 13.37 and the 200 at 27.59. The 4x800 team, Stephens, Amanda Seemann, Jamie Quenzer and Jami Williams ran an 11:18.42 for fourth.

Bethanie Linden was fifth in the high jump at 4'10" and the 300 meter hurdles at 52.96.

Stephenson was sixth in the 100 meter hurdles at 17.19. Williams was sixth in the 1600 at 6:38.9.

Brenn was sixth in the 400 at 1:04.12 and Swafford was sixth in the long jump at 15'3".

The boys were also fourth, with 45 points. Third place Great Bend had 89. Garden City had 145 and Liberal had 222.

Zach Brown was first with a 50.54 in the 400. The 4x400 team was also first with a 3:28.06. Damien Stephens, Bo Kleinsorge, Jason Simmering and Brown make up that team.

Brown was also second with a 6'2" high jump. The 4x100 team was third at 44.53. Brent and Wade McCoy, Stephens and Brown make up the team.

The 4x800 team, Simmering, Brandon Stupka, Tucker Stover and Chase Kough, ran a 9:00.91 for fourth.

Wade McCoy was fourth in the 200 at 23.50. Simmering was fifth in the 400 at 52.10. Stephens was sixth in the 200 at 23.65.



## Eagle records changing

The track record board in the Colby High School gym is in a state of flux this year as athletes move up or onto the board weekly.

Junior Jessie Brenn has moved up. Her 15.9 at Holcomb on April 20 took second at the meet and was third best in school history. Brenn was previously fourth on the list.

Ivy Ramsey, a freshman has moved onto the list in her first year. Ramsey ran the 1600 meter at Norton on April 24 in 5:35.2 for second place at the meet and fourth all-time.

Brenn, sophomores Lori Ziegelmeier and Breann Hart and freshman Brianna Swafford have tied for fifth place in the 4x100 relay records. They ran a 51.56 at Goodland on April 27, taking second at the meet.

Senior Zach Brown, in his first year in track, has made the board twice. Brown is number four in the high jump after a second-place 6'2" effort in Garden City on Tuesday. He is also fifth in the 400 after a 50.3 effort in Goodland that earned him first in the meet.

Two boys relay teams are moving up. The 4x100 relay team, Brown, fellow seniors Damien Stephens and Wade McCoy and sophomore Brent McCoy ran a first place 43.62 at Goodland, which tied them for second in school history.

The 4x400 team, Stephens, Brown, and Bo Kleinsorge, all seniors, with junior Jason Simmering are tied for third on the board after a 3:26.35 effort in Goodland earned them a first-place medal.
