


Rockies pitcher gets shutout against old team

DENVER (AP) — Mike Hampton did it all: with his arm, his bat, his glove and his baserunning.

Hampton's seven-hit shutout in the Colorado Rockies' 6-0 win over the New York Mets on Wednesday night prompted teammate Todd Walker to say, "To me, he's the best athlete I've

Rockies manager Buddy Bell agreed.

"He may be the best all-around pitcher I've ever been around, in terms of pitching, fielding, hitting, baserunning," Bell said.

Hampton tormented his former team, tossing his eighth career shutout while striking out five and walking three. He was backed by four double

Hampton, who went 15-10 in helping the Mets to the World Series last year, raised some eyebrows when he signed an eight-year, \$121 million con-

tract with Colorado in December.






