There are 230 employees staffed with 25 different departments. It costs nearly \$20 million a year to run the hospital. Our rural life style depends on this kind of health care. These facilities have a 1.9 percent profit for the year 2000.

Staffing is the most important part of these programs. The major reason for health care staffing problems is lack of dollars. This is due to the government reimbursement of Medicare. Equipment always needs to be brought up to date. Reimbursement is the third issue in health care. The Health Care Finance Committees is in charge of making the rules and regulation for reimbursement to health care facilities.

There are six times the number of rules and regulations for health care compared to the IRS. Regulation sometimes make it very hard to get treatment necessary for the patients because of cost.

GFWC Shakespeare Club met at the Prairie Museum of Art and History on Friday afternoon, April 27. In the absence of the president, Vice-President Diann Gerstner presided. Roll was answered by nine members and one guest, Don Crumbaker, by telling their favorite part of the museum.

Amie Kendrick reported that there were no entries in the Fine Arts competition this year. Jeanne Thyfault gave a nominating committee report. It was voted to accept the slate of officers by unanimous vote.

Joyce Hansen sent around a paper asking members to sign if they were or were not coming to the May 11 luncheon. She announced that the cost would be \$5. Dues will be due at the next meeting as well as installation of officers. The amount of the dues will be sent with the calling committee calls.

Diann Gerstner announced that the trash pickup has been rescheduled for May 7, same time, same place.

At the close of the meeting, Diann introduced Sue Taylor, director of the Prairie Museum of Art and History.

She gave a brief history of the reason for interest in the old buildings in the community. She said that in most communities, 50 percent of the population has lived in the community less than 20 years. So community residents are not familiar with family names or "old timers" in the community. Therefore, to get a sense of history, old buildings (more than 50 years old) are important to the history of a community. Sue put together a video of the old buildings in Colby as well as the WPA projects in the community *There's No Place Like Home*.

In the video, Franklin Roosevelt is pictured at his campaign stop in Colby. He was responsible for the WPA. In the 30's, there were 750 local people involved in the WPA projects. The local WPA projects include Fike Park, the viaduct, the club house for the Country Club, the municipal swimming pool, City Hall in 1934 (at a cost of \$23,000) the old high school in 1936 (at a cost of \$213,000) and the hospital in 1941.

Some of the old buildings that have been torn down include the Thomas County Bank, the Opera House, the Tabernacle, the Rock Island Depot and the Colby Grade School.

The Thomas County Courthouse, built in 1906, is on the National register. The Museum is interested in find-

ing innovative ideas in how to get more old building on the National register and using them in productive ways.

Sue took the members to preview the newest exhibit being prepared at the Museum. It is a collection of ceramics titled *Fired Up - The Art and Function*

of *Ceramics*. Of the 1,200 pieces in the collections, about 1,000 are from the Kuska collection.

Following the program, the hostess, Diann Gerstner served angel food cake with strawberries and *home made* ice cream.
