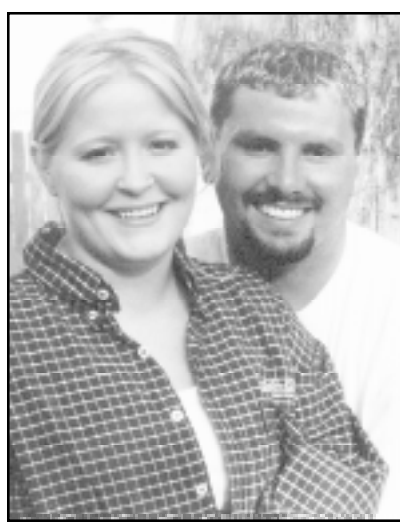


Carney and Vrbas set wedding date

Senior Ponderings - Helpful hints in safety proofing your home.

Floors - Be sure that carpet and rugs are smooth at the edges. Place slip resistant mats under throw rugs. Eliminate sills or thresholds between rooms, to prevent tripping. Choose carpeting with a low, light pile, which is less likely to catch a heel than the deep-pile variety. Place non-skid mats in spots that are frequently wet, such as entranceways and the kitchen-sink area. These precautions are particularly important for those who use walkers or wheelchairs.
