Estes Park proves to be a challenge

Special to the Free Press ESTES PARK, Colo. — The Estes Park Challenge, June 23-24, marked the first event in over a month for me. Since finishing 85th at my last race, I was looking for a better showing, especially in my own backyard. The course literally went past my house less than 100 feet away from my couch!

With my friends and employer involved in the race, the pressure was on. So, with an extraordinarily hot day for Estes Parka and with the wind howling down the mountain, I took the line for the first event, a time trial.

The time trial is called the race of truth since it's just you out there and nobody to pace you or draft off. It's really a type of race for my fitness level. Since I'm not a wafer thin climber, the kind of race that involve sheer power and strength favors my body type especially well. It's three miles of going all out.

It was slightly uphill and the entire time I felt out of sorts. Usually, the time trial is painful, but I couldn't seem to get settled into a rhythm regardless. As I crossed the finish line I didn't fell I had put in a very good time, but soon found out it was only two seconds off the winning pace and better than the times of two professional riders. Good enough for third.

The next event was the following day and with my start time being midmorning. I was able to sit and have my coffee on the deck while I watched everyone else race by.

After easing my way into the day, I dressed out and went across the street to the registration line. After a bit of warm-up, we took the line and were off. It was especially fin to be racing past my own home since my neighbors were all standing outside cheering me

The race began up a hill and straight into the win. I was careful to stay behind some other riders going into the wind conserve energy, but after climbing up 700 feet of elevation gain, the group had split up into two groups with me leading the second one.

After leaving the following group behind, I made it my business to reel back the group ahead. Within six miles, I had caught them and at the beginning of the second lap was leading them into

The group let me pull them around the course, riding close behind me and out of the wind, using all of my energy until the final sprint, where I was too spent to contend for the win. I had to settle for fourth, but was still happy with the result.

The professionals started just after my category and the race saw one of the country's best domestic pros as well as an international start with the Mercury team. The Mercury rider came very close to being selected for the Tour de France, which accepts only the top 189 riders in the world. After being denied, he set his sights on winning all of the other races he's in.

The following day, after the racing action was long over, I took off and rode up Trail Ridge Road to the Alpine Visitor's Center some 26 miles and 5,000 feet elevation gain away.

As I rode, I though about how, as a little boy, it used to be a big production that took all day to go up the same road while vacationing with my family. We used to pack the car with snacks, water and extra clothing (mom would always remind us that it was colder at the top.) There was snow for crying out

Now, her I was with little more than lycra clothing, a lightweight jacket and a granola bar to sustain men. I have to get some higher altitude training for the Triple By-Pass on July 14.

It's 120 miles from Evergreen to Avon with a 10,000 foot elevation gain. It makes Train Ridge Road look like Fike Park!


