

Colby Free Press LIBERAL—The Colby Babe Ruth baseball team went 1-2 at the regional tournament in Liberal over the weekend, earning fourth place honors and earning berths in the All-Star game in Great Bend for two places.

Brian Sulzman and Chris Gordon were selected to the Babe Ruth Classic in Great Bend on Aug. 12. Gordon had to refuse his selection of alternate due to prior commitments, but Sulzman will be going to the game.
