# Parenting group celebrating 23 years

Colby Free Press The first week in August was World Breastfeeding Week. The local La Leche League group is celebrating its 23rd anniversary and all families who have ever had a breastfed child, past or present, are invited to a potluck picnic, Sunday, Sept. 9, at 6 p.m. in Colby's

Connie Davis, leader of the Colby group, began the local group 23 years ago. "I came from Salina in 1976 and before I left, a leader there said I could start a group in Colby," she said. "I laughed. But I did. It took me two years of study during the application process before I began the group in 1978. I have a picture from the Colby Free Press of our first meeting, with me holding 3week-old (but still one week prema-

"Meetings have been much the same over the 23 years that the local group has been meeting in northwest Kansas," said Davis. "In fact, most of the information on breastfeeding management is the same, which is a good reflection on what we were taught years ago. Breastfeeding success is largely based on mother-to-mother help and we are still doing that. One change might be that fathers are welcome to attend any or all of the series meetings, and 23 years ago we had to hold a separate couples meeting if fathers wanted to attend. Now we know that the father or other close family member is the best support for the mother so it makes sense to have them learn right along with the mother.

"Another change is that parents drive long distances to the meetings. At the meeting on Sunday, one mother was from Oakley, and two from Hoxie. It is not unusual to see parents from Goodland, Burlington, Colo., St. Fran-Twenty-three years ago, there were

active groups in Goodland, Atwood, the experts and all we do is provide Colby, Grinnell, Quinter, WaKeeney, Hill City, Clayton, Luray, and Hays. Some towns had two different groups meeting each month, and these meetings were led by more than one local leader. Now, there is one group meeting between Salina and Colorado, La Leche League of Northwest Kansas.

"The format is still the same, "Davis explains. "Meetings are informal, center around a theme at each of four meetings, but individual sharing and questions are most important. We want to address the concerns of those present, no matter what age or stage of their baby. We have a lending library of upto-date books on breastfeeding, birthing, and childcare. Leaders are accredited through La Leche League International and must attend continuing education events twice a year. This spring I went to Wichita for a medical seminar and then last month I attended the International Conference of La Leche League International in Chi-

resources from which they may choose what works in their families.3

When Davis attended the Chicago conference, one speaker was the Surgeon General of the United States. He explained that breastfeeding has been identified as a high priority objective for the year 2001, with a goal of increasing to at least 75 percent the proportion of mothers who breastfeed their infants in the early postpartum period and to at least 50 percent those who breastfeed until the infant is six months of age. The American Academy of Pediatrics also concurs with these goals, suggesting that breastfeeding is the preferred method of infant feeding for the first year and beyond.

"It takes an environment of awareness and support in order for mothers to breastfeed, since it is a learned art," said Davis.
