"A trainer will come to the high school once a week on Mondays from 1 to 3 p.m.," he said. In explaining how this new program would work, Quenzer gave an example of an athlete who is injured late in the week and after the weekend still is hurting. In that scenario, the trainer could be an option.

In this example, he said the administration would encourage students and their parents to call the high school and make an appointment to see the trainer on Monday. Although, he was quick to point out that the trainer is not a physician. 'What the trainer can do is evaluate and recommend exercises or suggest that a doctor might be the appropriate choice depending on the injury.

There will also be a free clinic at the Sandhill facility in Garden City, open on Saturdays from 9 a.m. until the last person is seen. Again, he said, these are all free services and available for Colby middle school and high school students participating in activities


