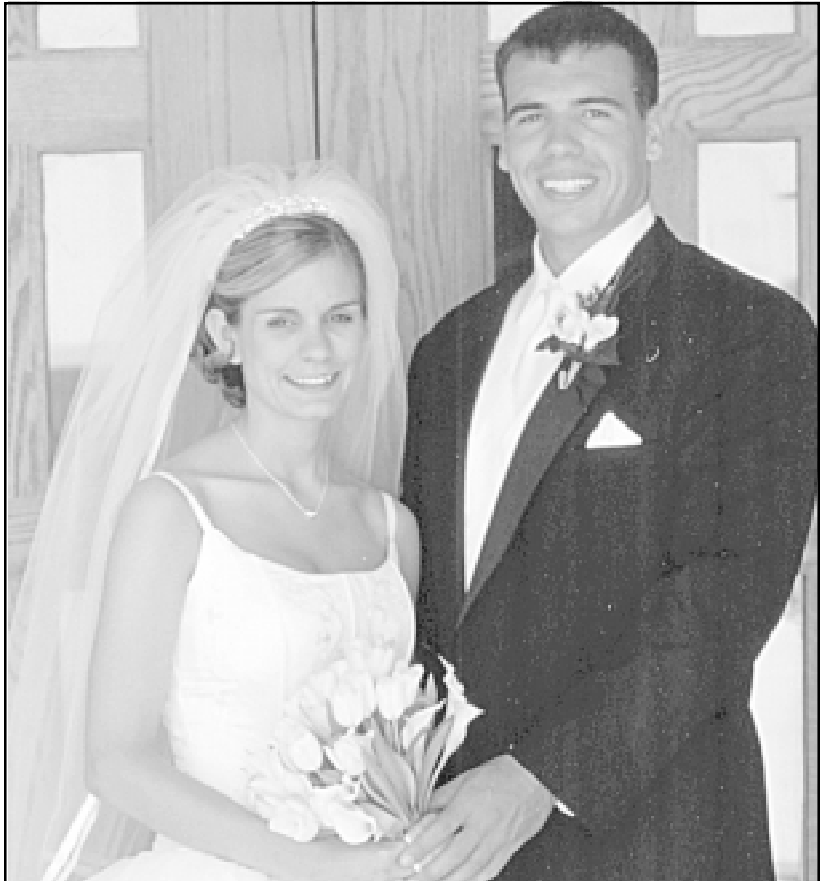
Ryan and Newton married
