

Wildcats reschedule season end

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) - Missouri and No. 12 Kansas State have agreed to delay their Nov. 17 Big 12 regular-season football finale by a week.

The schools made the switch to Nov. 24 so the Wildcats can make up their game against Louisiana Tech, which was postponed following

last week's terrorist attacks in New York and Washington.

"I think it's as good as you can expect," Kansas State coach Bill Snyder said of the rescheduling. "I appreciate the University of Missouri moving back a week.'

The Missouri-Kansas State game will still be played in Manhattan. Game time is tentatively set for 1 p.m.

This is the second switch Missouri has made because of the attacks. The Tigers' game against Michigan State, also scheduled for Sept. 15 and postponed last week, will be played Dec. 1 in East Lansing, Mich.

That is the same date as the Big 12 Championship game. The game against the Spartans will not be played if Missouri wins the Big 12 North division, qualifying for the title game.

"It makes perfect sense for us to move the Kansas State game," Missouri coach Gary Pinkel said.




