Robert H. (Bob) Schoendaller of Colby, 78, died Aug. 27, 2001, at Citizens Medical Center.

He was born in Hyacinth, on Feb. 25, 1923, and lived in the Oakley and Monument area most of his young life. He attended the Monument School, but graduated high school from St. Joseph's Military Academy in Hays.

He was inducted into the Army Air Force and was very proud of his record. Shortly after his promotion to sergeant, he was assigned to a B-17 flight crew as a ball turret gunner.

After his discharge, he moved to Denver. On Aug. 30, 1952, he married Irene M. Vandenburg at the Immaculate Conception Cathedral in Denver.
