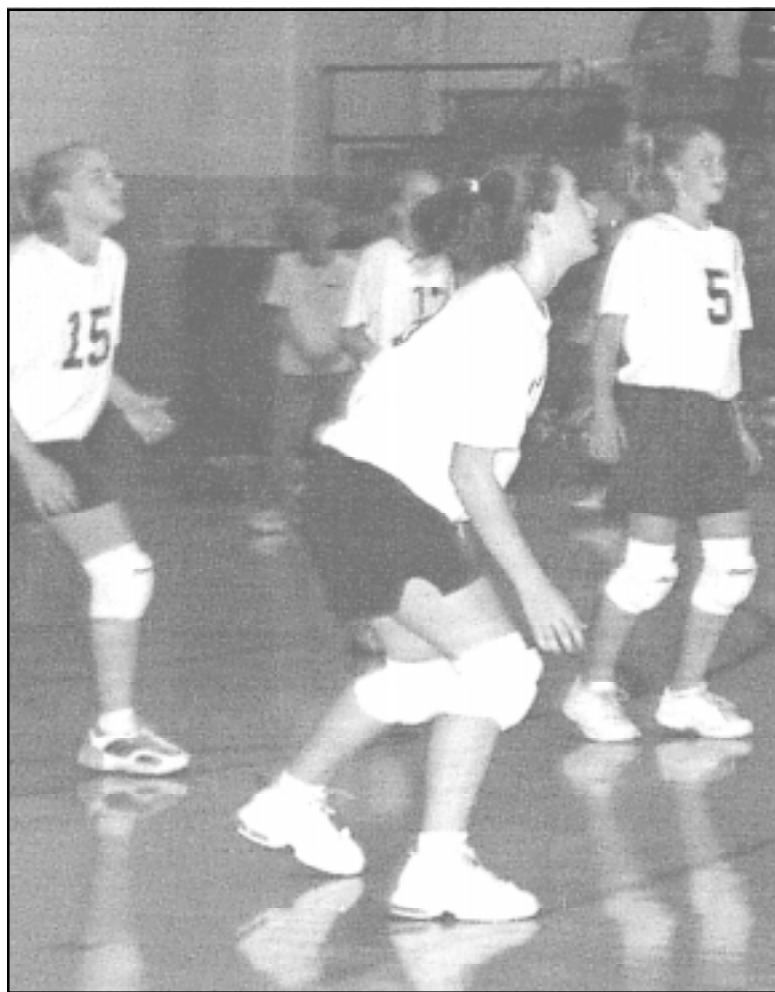

**Bonds breaks different record**  
HOUSTON (AP) — Barry Bonds broke Babe Ruth's walks record instead of making home run history, scoring three times to lead San Francisco over Houston 11-8. With three walks, Bonds eclipsed Ruth's mark of 170 set in 1923 and finished the night with 172. Bonds has four games remaining to match Mark McGwire's 1998 record of 70 home runs.

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Rickey Henderson tied Ty Cobb's 73-year-old major league record of 2,245 runs, racing in from first base on Ryan Klesko's two-run double in the third inning of San Diego's 12-5 loss to the Dodgers. Henderson needs three hits to become the 25th player to reach 3,000.

On Monday, they went to El Dorado, falling to Butler County in three games. The score for each of the three games was 30-27.

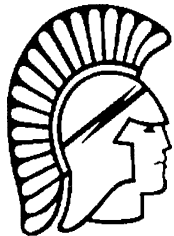
On Wednesday, they were in Dodge City, winning three of four. They won the first two games 30-22, 30-25, fell in game

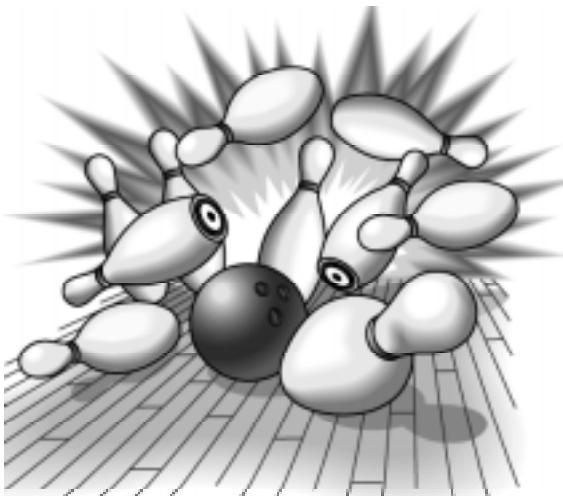
