Colby Free Press Colby High School varsity girls tennis took third at the Class 4A Regional Tennis Tournament in Scott City on Monday, sending Katie Lang and the doubles team of Dominique Palser and Ashley Amos to the state tournament in Pratt Satur-

"Some of the team were a bit sluggish at first," said coach Mike Sprenkel, "while other team members were rather nervous. It cost us, but I'm sure it will be a valuable learn-

ing experience for next year."

Lang went 3-1, losing to the no. 1 seed from Kingman in round three, but coming back to avenge Crystal Mannebach's loss against the no. 3 seed from Larned. Lang finished the season at 15-8.

"Katie played extremely well and a few of the other regional coaches thought their semi-final match against Williams should have been the championship match," said Sprenkel. "If she continues with the aggressive style that earned her the third place finish, she should do well at state."

"Palser and Amos shook off the sluggish feeling and bounced back to qualify for state, playing extremely well in the second set of the consolation finals," said Sprenkel. Their record is 15-6.

"If these two play like they are capable and reduce the unforced errors, they should excel at state."

Mannebach fell to the no. 3 seed from Larned in round two, finishing the season with a 14-7 record.

"Crystal had a fantastic season, upsetting quite a few players that have had previous varsity experience," said Sprenkel.

"She is one of the best freshman that I have coached in tennis."

Diane Wilson and Becky Lang finished the season at 11-7. They won their first round match, but were beaten in the second round.

"Diane and Becky were disappointed with the outcome of regionals, but got some valuable experience," said Sprenkel. "I'm sure they will use this next year."

Braves go with 3-man rotation




