SUZUKA, Japan (AP)—Michael Schumacher, who clinched his fourth Formula One title in August, came up with a perfect ending to a championship season by winning the Japan Grand Prix for his record-tying ninth victory of 2001.

The victory allowed Schumacher to pass Alain Prost's record of 798.5 career championships points. Schumacher now has won nine races in a season three times, having also done so last year and in 1995. The only other driver with that many victories in a year was Nigel Mansell in 1992

MONTEREY, Calif. (AP) — A perfect fuel strategy by Team Rahal gave Max Papis a victory in the Honda Grand Prix as Gil de Ferran's

third-place finish solidified his lead in the CART championship chase.
