Grinnell scored again at 9:30 and 4:22 in the third.

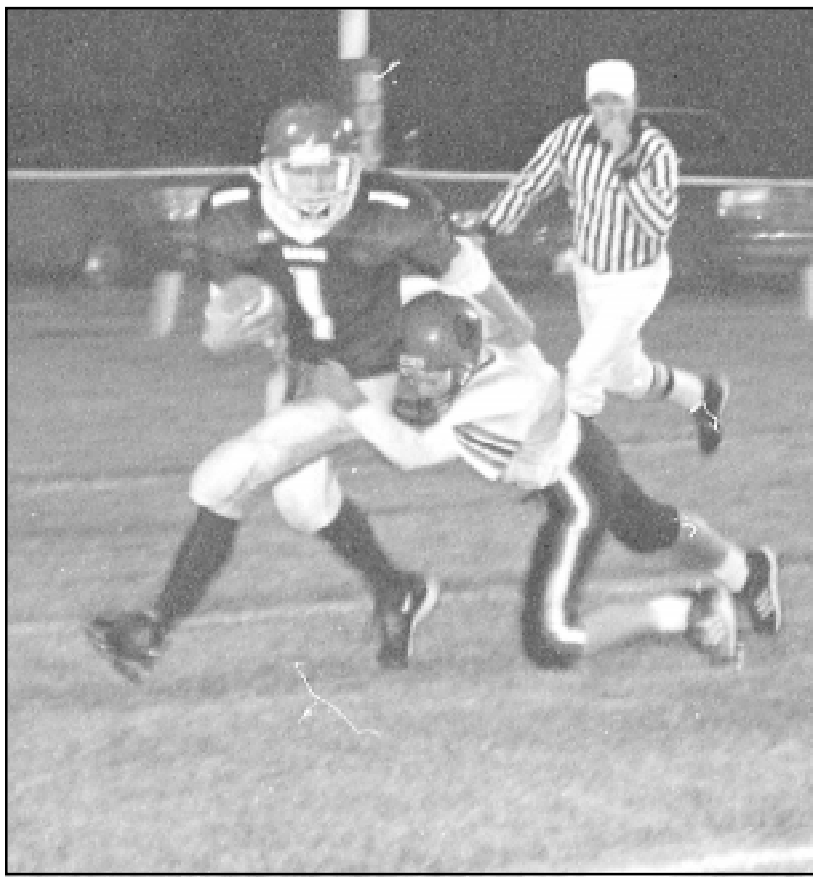
The game ended on the 45-point rule after the last touchdown.

The Lady Bulldogs have been busy in the last week. They took fourth in the Western Kansas Liberty League Tournament, also in Brewster on Saturday and were seeded third in the region.

They opened Tuesday's tournament with a win over Tribune in three games. They lost the first game 15-8 and won the next two, 15-6, 15-13. Weskan made short work of the Lady 'Dawgs, 15-7, 15-9 before being eliminated in the championship by Sharon Springs.
