
Trojans are Ambassador Classic champs

LAWRENCE (AP) — Iowa State out and played excellent football in all speak.

The 6-4 Cyclones are in the hunt for their second straight trip to a bowl and a third place finish in the Big 12 North.

Conversely, the 2-8 Jayhawks are hunting for direction, a head coach and stability after losing Saturday to Iowa State 49-7.

Iowa State's offense ran through a porous Kansas defense for 320 yards, led by senior running back Ennis Haywood's 185 yards and four touchdowns. It was the Cyclones' first win in Lawrence since 1989.

Officials from the Independence Bowl were on hand to scout Iowa State, who faces Iowa next week in Ames.
