The foundation wants to offer more to the 17 participating communities, and announced a matching fund drive opportunity. The non-profit Thomas County Foundation was established in response to the challenge, and opted to go for the \$300,000 level program. If that amount is raised by or pledged to the county foundation by year's end, the Kansas Health Foundation will match it. Thomas County Foundation would offer grants to county non-profit entities in a locally-controlled manner.

With just one and a half months remaining, the fund drive is not yet to the halfway mark and the Thomas County Foundation is actively soliciting business and individual donations, which are tax-deductible.

After the buffet dinner, in observance of Veterans Day, Lion Virgil Jones offered pie alamode to all veterans. Lion Koon asked each veteran to speak about their military experience.

Lion Matt Hamill served 1944-46 in the Navy. He was assigned with seven other seamen to a radar division to protect the East Coast. He was 30 years old, married, two children. "The worst experience of the ordeal was saying good-by to my family."

Lion Bob Urbom was inducted into the Army Dec. 7, 1941. He was a "90 Day Wonder." He was one of seven out of his outfit to be chosen for OCS school. He was assigned second lieutenant to a tank division in the Mohave desert. When the 1st lieutenant was shot he was made captain of the tank company. They got surrounded by Germans, and a sniper shot him in the side. When he got out of a hospital in Paris he was sent to England and was in charge of a German prison stockade. While he was in England he met his wife Natalie in an officers club in 1945. They were married in England.

Lion Stan Davis served in the Korea War. He went in January 1951 and served in the 7th infantry tank 73rd division. He served his two years in Korea and was discharged in 1953.

Lion Darrel Follis served in the Army. He went to Korea in Dec. 1950. He was in Korea in the winter and he said, he "decided he would never like winter again." He got caught in a sniper fire but escaped, "The Lord was with me and I was glad to have served my country and get back home."

Lion Elmer Lawver joined the Navy while he was in high school. His brother had been killed in Italy and he wanted to go kill some Nazis. He joined the Navy because he wanted to have a place to sleep. He serve on board of the USS Antietam, an air craft carrier. He sailed to Australia, China, Philippines, and Japan. When he got discharged he joined the Reserves and was called back into service in 1951 for the Korean War.
