

Eagles fall to Wray 58-56 in road game

WRAY, Colo. — The Colby High School Eagle boys' basketball team got off to a 20-9 start, but couldn't hold on as they lost a 58-56 heartbreaker to the Wray Eagles Tuesday.

The Eagles led 20-9 at the end of the first quarter and survived a Wray comeback in the second to lead 36-34 had half-time.

Colby's lead dropped to one at the end of three and Wray was able to just pull ahead in the fourth.

Although the Eagles shot only 38

percent from the field, their rebounding has steadily improved throughout the season. Colby had 35 total rebounds, with 20 coming on the offensive board.

Jordan Harris had a double-double, the first of the season. He had 19 points and 15 rebounds, along with a team-leading three steals and three assists.

Landon Stover had 11 points, two rebounds, two steals and an assist.

Shane Stover had nine points, four rebounds and an assist.

Ryan Arensdorf had six points, three rebounds and a steal.

Carson McKee had five points, five rebounds, two steals and led the team with four assists.

Clayton Kaiser had four points and three rebounds.

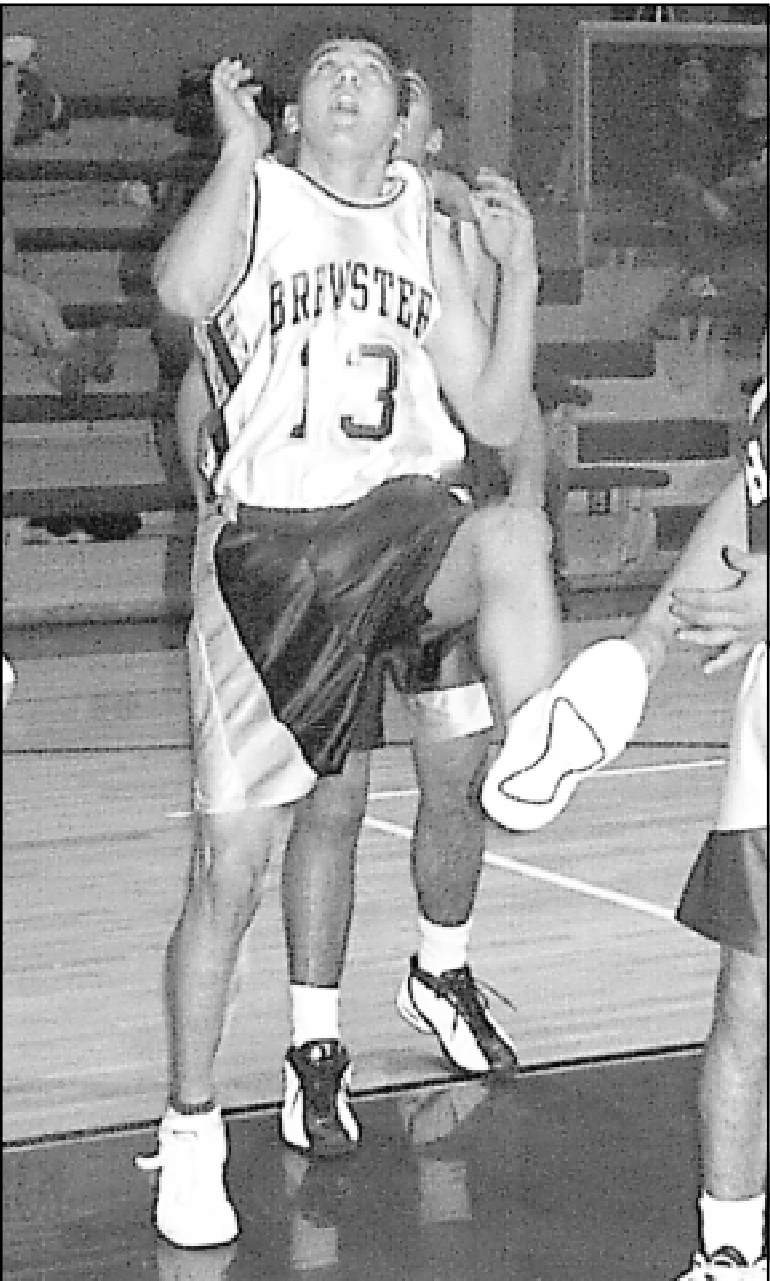
Tucker Stover had two points, two rebounds and two assists. Jared Cranston had a board, two
