Q: Does VA provide disability pension benefits to veterans?

A. Veterans with low incomes who are permanently and totally disabled may be eligible, for pension benefits if they have 90 days or more of active military service, at least one day of which was during a period of war. The discharge from active duty must have been under conditions other than dishonorable. The permanent and total disability must be for reasons other than the veteran's own willful misconduct. Payments are made to qualified




