LIBERAL — The Colby High School wrestling overcame a bad start Friday to finish sixth at the Liberal Invitational Tournament on Saturday.

Two Eagles, Eric Luedke and Eric Seemann, finished first in their divisions. Schuyler Sharpe finished second and both Rusty Raymo and Scottie Lindberg finished sixth.

"We came out really flat on Friday," said coach Mitch Beims. "We wrestled better on Saturday, but it was too late."

Beims added, "I didn't have the team ready to wrestle following the Christmas holiday. We will be back on track




