Albert Carl Garrett died Sunday, Dec. 31, 2000, at Lantern Park Manor in Colby. He was born in a sod house on a farm northeast of Levant, Feb. 22, 1908, the son of Wm. (Bill) and Florence Mae (Elliott) Garrett. He was a lifetime resident of Thomas County and attended school at Levant.

He married Anna Maude Rhoten in Oberlin, April 19, 1926. They lived in Levant for a time before moving to Rexford in July of 1929 where they made their home until August 1986 when they moved to Colby.

Albert was a mechanic, farmer and rancher who practiced the golden rule every day of his life and believed in serving his community. He was a charter member of Rexford Lions Club; he and Maude were members of the Ring-neck Campers club and officers in the National camper and Hikers Association, the Good Sam Club and the Saddle and Bridle Club. Albert was chairman of the Thomas County Rodeo for a number of years and was a gold card member of the PRCA. He served on the Rexford City Council and was mayor for a number of years.

He also served on the Rexford school board and the Thomas county Hospital Board, as well as various other township and county boards. In recent years he enjoyed playing cards at the Red Barn in Rexford and the fellowship and dining at the Senior Progress Center in Colby.
