It was anybody's game with Hutch leading at the half by just 4 points, 54-50. Colby managed to outscore the visitors in the second half by a razor thin 38-37 but that mere 1 point wasn't enough to close the last leak in the dike.

At one point in the second half the Trojans moved in front of the Blue Dragons by 10—70-60—but then the walls collapsed as Hutch went on a stinging 15-2 run and never looked


