The Colby High School boys' basketball team ended a 3-game skid Friday night with a 71-60 home win over Quinter in the Community Building.

The Colby boys jumped out to a 22-16 lead at the end of the first quarter and had led by eight at one time.

Colby buried the Bulldogs in the second quarter, going into the break with a 42-25 lead.

Colby's lead increased to 20 in the third quarter. Although Quinter was able to battle back a few times, they never got any closer than 15. The quarter ended with Colby leading 58-38.

Colby held on to a 20-point lead until the two minute mark, when Quinter made their last run, but Colby held on

for the win.

Eagle scoring was led by a 33-point performance from Jordan Harris. Harris shot an phenomenal 76.5 percent from 2-point range along with five rebounds, three steals and three assists.

Clayton Kaiser had 12 points, led the team with six boards, had a steal and five assists before coming out with a twisted ankle in the fourth quarter.

Shane Stover had nine points, three rebounds as steal and two assists. Landon Stover had eight points, four rebounds a steal and three assists.

Matt Augustine had four points, five rebounds and six assists. Carson McKee led the team with seven assists, along with two boards and three points.

Wyatt Rundel had two points. Will Higerd had four rebounds. Tucker Sto-

ver had a rebound and an assist.
