Playing in their final home contest Wednesday are Billy Williams, Brent Brooks, and Korey Brown. We thank each of these young men for their contributions to our program. We also thank their local hoops family for their support the past couple of years.

Barton County enters the game with a 20-8 record. Their conference mark stands at 9-5, and they are in third place. A season ago we defeated Barton in Colby 93-83. Barton finished fourth in the league standings last season but won the Region VI title and finished seventh in the National Tournament.

We enter Wednesday night's game with a 16-13 overall mark. The young Trojans have been very tough at home. We have lost just four home games all season and those have been by a total of six points. In two previous home games the Trojans defeated then #16 Seward County 78-76 and then Garden City 77-76.

The Trojans lost the last meeting between the teams played in Great Bend by just 4 points. We are 9-4 at home on the year and 5-7 on the road. We are 2-2 on a neutral floor.






