

# **Colby grad qualifies** for NCAA II tourney

Free Press Publisher There will be a familiar face at this week's (March 8-9) NCAADivision II Wrestling Championships at Kenosha, Wis. Familiar, that is, to Colby wrestling fans.

The face is that of Riley Ross, son of Robb and Julie Ross, and a graduate of Colby High School, where he made a name for himself on the wrestling mat.

Riley is wrestling for the University of Nebraska at Kearney Lopers and is one of the school-record seven wrestlers qualifying for the NCAA showdown.

A junior wrestler in his senior year — he was a red-shirt freshman, giv-Riley takes to the mat in the 165-lb. weight class. He was one of the Lopers receiving a No. 1 seed at the recent Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference (RMAC) Tournament, and went on to win his weight class.

The tourney allowed Riley to place still another notch on his belt because, for the second time in the past couple of weeks, he beat Dave Vondy of Western State/Gunnison, Colo., 3-2. Vondy, it should be mentioned, is the defending national champion at 165.

Another outstanding Loper wrestler is Bryce Abbey, a freshman from Goodland, who also will be going to off their perch.

the national championships. Abbey wrestles at 125.

The Lopers earned the titles of RMAC/West Regional Champions, compiling 111.5 points (RMAC race) and 108.5 (Region race). The Lopers, incidentally, are ranked 6th nationally.

Coach Marc Bauer was named RMAC Coach of the Year, an honor he first won in 2000 when he led the Lopers to their first conference championship.

Riley, who is majoring in sports administration at UNK, graduated from Colby High School in 1998. His high school wrestling career included being a three-time state qualifier and two-time state placer. He wrestled at 145 his senior year, and as a freshman competed at 119 lbs

"Our league is so tough," forward Nick Collison said after the Jayhawks became the first team in the 6-year-old league to go unbeaten with a 95-92 victory over nemesis Missouri on Sunday. "No one in college basketball is going through their league undefeated, and to do it in one of the top two conferences in the nation, it says a lot."

To do it at Missouri says even more. Five of the last six times Kansas (27-2, 16-0) played at Missouri with a Top 5 ranking, it lost. That includes 1997 and '98, when the Jayhawks absorbed their lone conference loss each time. In 1997, they also were No. 1 and lost their only regular-season game in double-overtime

Big Eight team to go unbeaten, doing it in 1994, and wanted that distinction to stand a little longer in the Big 12, which added four former Southwest Conference schools six years ago.

"They're terrific, no question about it," coach Quin Snyder said. "They've done something that no team in the Big 12 has ever done. We were hell-bent on not letting that happen."

So the best thing about beating Missouri, the way Kansas coach Roy Williams saw it, was he won't have to answer questions about why he didn't win.

"And the second best, and it is in that order, is that it makes us 16-0," he said. 'They did get very enthused and ready to play us, perhaps more ready to play us than anybody else."

There was quite a bit of celebrating

Missouri (20-10, 9-7) was the last as the Kansas players left the court with rebounds and Kirk Hinrich had 25 their fingers raised high in the air. Guard Kirk Hinrich entered the locker room with a shout of "Making history!"

> Still, Kansas has had a handful of close calls during its run, winning in overtime at Texas Feb. 11 and beating Nebraska by a point Feb. 24. So Williams said he didn't think about going unbeaten until after the Jayhawks' 103-68 victory over Kansas State on Wednesday,

> "It's a happy locker room," Williams said. "The kids, they never had a goal to be 16-0, but as it came closer down the stretch they were asked about it so often.

"It never became a goal of mine until after the Kansas State game, but it feels good to do it now."

Collison had 28 points and seven 91 with 1:57 to go.

points and nine rebounds for Kansas. which overcame foul trouble to guard Jeff Boschee and an off game by forward Drew Gooden.

Gooden had 15 points on 5-of-17 shooting and Boschee had seven points, half of his average, in only 15 minutes.
