Italian Sausage Strata

12 ounces mild Italian sausage, casings removed

1/8 teaspoon black pepper

heat. Add sausage and cook, breaking up with a spoon, until sausage begins to lose its pink color. Add onion and red pepper, continue cooking 5 minutes longer. Set aside. Heat milk, in microwave oven, in glass measuring cup until bubbles appear around edges. In large bowl, whisk eggs, then gradually whisk in hot milk. Blend in mustard and dry seasonings. Lightly butter 8 x 12 glass baking dish. Line bottom with some of the bread slices, trimming to fit as needed (use scraps to fill in gaps.) Sprinkle with 1 cup cheese, top with sausage mixture, then line with remaining bread slices, trimmed as needed. Slowly pour egg mixture over bread slices, pressing slices down lightly to submerge. Sprinkle with remaining 1/3 cup cheese. Place dish on baking sheet and bake for 45-50 minutes, (or until knife inserted in center comes out clean.) Let stand 10 minutes before serving. Makes 6-8 servings.
