County health explains impetigo

Have you or your children ever had impetigo? This is a skin infection caused by Staphylococcus or Streptococcus, leading to the formation of small pus-filled blisters (pustules). Affecting mostly children, impetigo, can appear anywhere on the body but and legs. The blisters can vary from

pea-sized to large rings. Impetigo may follow an injury or a condition that causes a break in the skin, such as a fungal infection, sunburn, or insect bite. Impetigo may also affect normal skin, especially on children's legs.

Early treatment can prevent impetigo from infecting the deeper skin (ecthyma). An antibiotic such as penicillin or a cephalosporin is usually taken by mouth. Rarely, impetigo caused by Streptococcus may lead to kidney failure. See your health care provider if you suspect this skin condition.

Ringworm is a fungal skin infection caused by several different fungi and generally classified by its location on the body. Athlete's foot (foot ringworm) is a common fungal infection that usually appears during warm weather. It's usually caused by either Trichophyton or Epidermophyton, fungi that can grow in the warm, moist areas between the toes.

The fungus can produce very mild scaling without other symptoms or more severe scaling with an itchy, raw, painful rash between the toes and over the sides of the feet. Fluid-filled blisters can also form.

Because the fungus may cause the skin to crack, athlete's foot can lead to bacterial infection, especially in the elderly and in people with inadequate blood flow to the feet. Jock itch (groin ringworm) can be caused by a variety of fungi and yeasts.

It's much more common in men than in women and develops more frequently in warm weather. The infection produces red, ring-like areas, sometimes with small blisters in the skin around the groin and over the upper, inner thighs. The condition can be quite

Scalp ringworm is caused by Trichophyton or Microsporum, another fungus. Scalp ringworm is highly contagious, especially among children. It may produce a red scaly rash that may be somewhat itchy, or it may produce a patch of hair loss without a rash. Nail ringworm is an infection of the nail caused by Trichophyton. The fungus nail, producing a thickened, lusterless, and deformed nail. Infection is much more common on the toenails than on the fingernails. An infected toenail may separate from the toe, crumble, or flake off.

Body ringworm also results from Trichophyton. The infection generally produces a pink to red rash that sometimes forms round patches with clear areas in the center. Body ringworm can ringworm is rare. Most skin infections in the beard area are caused by bacteria, not fungi.

Most fungal skin infections, except those of the scalp and nails, are mild, and antifungal creams usually cure promote fungal growth. them. Many effective antifungal creams can be purchased without a prescription. Antifungal powders are generally not as good for treating fungal infections. The active ingredients in antifungal medications include applied to the skin; others prescribe miconazole, clotrimazole, econazole, antibiotics that must be taken by and ketoconazole. Usually, creams are applied twice a day, and treatment should continue for 7 to 10 days after the rash completely disappears. If the cream is stopped too soon, the infection may not be eradicated, and the rash will return.

prescription. For more serious or stubborn infections, a health care provider may prescribe several months of therapy with griseofulvin, sometimes together with antifungal creams. Griseofulvin, which is taken by mouth is very effective, but it may cause side effects such gets into the newly forming part of the as headache, upset stomach, sensitivity to light, rashes, swelling, and reduced numbers of white blood cells. After treatment with griseofulvin stops, the infection may return. A health care provider may also prescribe ketoconazole for fungal skin infections. Like griseofulvin, oral ketoconazole can have serious side effects, including liver disease.

Keeping the infected areas clean and dry helps thwart further fungal growth develop anywhere on the skin. Beard and promote skin healing. If a fungal skin infection oozes, a bacterial infection also may have developed. Such an infection may require treatment with antibiotics. Some doctors prescribe antibiotics that can be mouth. 


