There were 16 boys and two girls in the senior class that year. Six of the students had begun their schooling together, in the first primary class of the building that still houses our students. They were the 13th graduating class of Brewster High School.

Eight of the boys were first string football players, two second string. Both of the girls from this class were first team basketball players. Members of this class were: Ernest Andrews, Bob Baird, John Brooks, George Coffey, James Forbes, Thomas Free-

man, Nina Van Meter, Duane Horney, Wallace Hurlbut, Ralph Jones, Marie Hilton, LaVelle Michael, Virgil Parker, Thelbert Ryan, Glenn Shalz, Bert Strait, Hubert Ulrey, and Elmer Winslow. Bob Baird, George Coffey, LaVelle Michael and Nina Van Meter Hansen are the living members. George, Bob and LaVelle were honored at the homecoming parade of 2000, whose theme was appropriately, *Walking Down Memory Lane*. They were co-grand marshals of the parade.

A few of the highlights from their graduation was the processional,

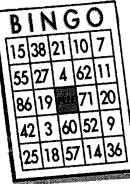

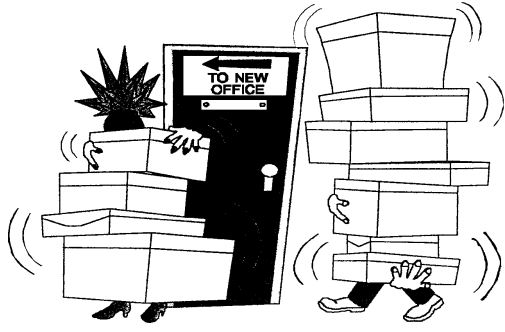

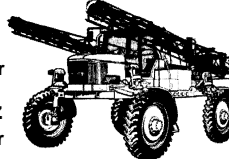
