Whearty and Dowell set date

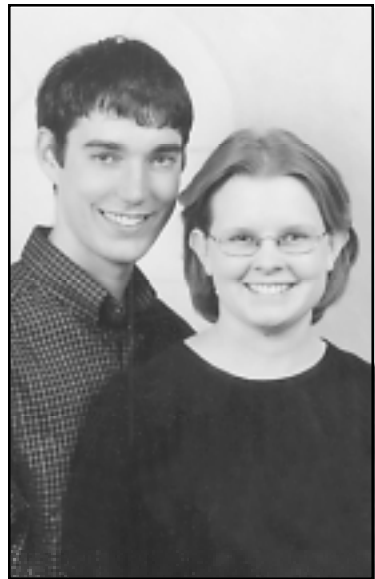
Jennifer Whearty and Steven Dowell announce their approaching marriage.


