## Congress calls for mandatory drug testing

WASHINGTON (AP) — Saying that tolerance of steroid use is sending a dangerous message to children, the House on Monday urged major league baseball and its players to start a mandatory steroid testing program.

"Failure to test and reports of abuse tell young people that drug use is not only permissible but desirable," said Rep. Nancy Johnson, R-Conn., sponsor of the resolution. "That's exactly the wrong message to send to our children."

The nonbinding resolution was approved by a voice vote.

The use of steroids among baseball differed on whether testing for steroids players became an issue after former should be mandatory. Players Associa-National League MVP Ken Caminiti tion executive director Donald Fehr admitted using steroids, which help told the Senate Commerce Committee build body strength by creating testosterone, and estimated that half of the sport's players take the illegal drug. The NBA has mandatory random

tests for steroids and the NFL also tests for the drug. But baseball's union has random testing was "the only way to so far resisted testing, citing privacy concerns.
